Opinion

*1 Appellee Kanye West moves to dismiss the appeal as untimely filed. Upon due consideration, it is hereby ORDERED that Appellee's motion is GRANTED, in part, and the appeal is DISMISSED for lack of jurisdiction to the extent it challenges the district court's July 2016 judgment dismissing the action and closing the case. *See* Fed. R. App. P. 4(a)(1); *Bowles v. Russell*, 551 U.S. 205, 214 (2007). It is further ORDERED that Appellee's motion is DENIED, in part, to the extent the appeal challenges the district court's two September 2016 post-judgment orders.
